
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WILD WOMEN (2018)

The series *Wild Women* is the final project of a Photography Masters of Arts course at Potsdam University of Applied Sciences. *Wild Women* portrays women who act directed by an internal instinctive wild woman. The series is inspired by *Women Who Run With the Wolves*, a book of folklore stories of the wild woman archetype by Clarissa Pinkola Estés.

During the making of the series the process of working with the models turned out to be as important as the final result. The subjects themselves could decide where and how they want to be portrayed. The women in the pictures seem simultaneously fragile yet powerful, calm yet fierce.






SELF-PORTRAITS (2021)

The self-portrait series researches inner light and darkness – the layer between reality and unconsciousness. The photos are surrounded by a glow that shines through a gap to an extraordinary world. The viewer gets close, yet a gloomy curtain remains inbetween, as if peeking to another dimension.

LIFE-DEATH-LIFE (2022)

Life-Death-Life depicts life in an old farm house where time has stopped but something is still alive. It explores the circle of life that essentially includes death. Thematically the series addresses roots, the chain of generations and continuity of life in rural areas.

PLASTIC FANTASY (2023)

Plastic Fantasy (dir. Ronja Tammenpää) is a satire depiction of a house wife looking for colour in her life. Enchanted by a network marketeer she is convinced plastic kitchenware is all she has been longing for.

The film criticises the fantasy life of trend-based consumerism where the planet pays the price. The overconsumption of internal and external resources is amplified by social media, leading to the brink of mental health.

The work is currently in post production and will premiere in autumn 2023. The cinematography is done by Tapio Antere and the film is produced by Rämefilms.





















GODDESS PORTRAITS (2023)

Goddess Portraits explores seeing and being seen in the full complexity and radiance of the feminine through the lens of a camera. The series is focused on the process of being photographed and the emotional states of being seen with all that is present.

The series showcases the infinite faces of the goddess taking finite form in all living beings. It expands the stereotype of "feminine" and supports the healing of the collective wounds around it. Every being is unique and yet of the same source, so, by default, divine.
